


Our Higher Education students enjoy having their own exclusive facilities at Norfolk House and Easton College.



Progress to the next level

The vast majority of our students have clear career related goals and progression in mind. That's why our degree level courses are explicitly designed to make sure you can achieve this.

The Graduate Outcomes survey confirms that our students are successful in achieving this: 97% of full time graduates are in employment six months after completing their programme with us. 100% of part time graduates are in highly skilled employment or further study 6 months after completing their degree. This is taken from the TEF (Teaching Excellence and Student Outcomes Framework) Year 4 – Published by the Office for Students, January 2019.

This places us in the top 10% nationally and, although not captured by the Graduate Outcomes survey, we know that in many instances our graduates progress on to higher level roles with more responsibility and increased opportunities for further career progression.


Students' Union

Disabled Students Allowance

If you have a learning difficulty. disability, mental health difficulty or long-term condition that could affect your studies, you may be entitled to additional support.

You can apply for DSA (Disabled Students' Allowance) to fund any additional support which you should apply for as soon as you have been offered a place on your chosen course. The process can take up to several weeks, especially during peak times.

Fees & financial assistance

Full time students

The cost of our full time FdA, FdSc, BA (Hons) & BSc (Hons) courses is £8,000 per year except for our higher fees courses (listed opposite) which are £9,000 per year.

Part-time students

To study our degree courses part time (based on 60 credits being attempted per academic year), our fees are £4,000 per year except for our higher fees courses which are £4,500 per year.

Our HNC and HND courses can be studied part time: our fees are £765 per 15 credit module.

International students

The Higher Fee courses (as listed above) are £13,000 per year. All other Foundation and Bachelor degrees have a full-time course fee of £12,000 per year.

Please note the BSc (Hons)
Professional Aviation Engineering
Practice will cost £13,000 for
the 2022/23 academic year.

If studying on a HNC or HND programme, the fee will be £920 per 15 credit unit.

For HNC and HND courses, there is an additional registration fee of £206 for HNC and £262 for HND in first year and a £21 annual registration fee in each subsequent year.

Student loans

You will normally be eligible for a tuition fee loan from Student Finance England to cover the cost of fees. There may also be maintenance loans available depending on your circumstances. Student loans do not have to be paid back until after you complete your course and you are earning at least £27,295.

If you have dependent children you may be eligible for other help such as a Parents' Learning Allowance or a Childcare Grant. If you are disabled, you may be eligible for the Disabled Students' Allowance.

To make the experience as rewarding and enjoyable as possible, we have a dedicated International Team who can help with your choice of course. application and immigration procedures. While here in Norwich and studying at our Colleges, our International Team will take a keen interest in your welfare, helping with visa renewals, fees and other financial matters, and any personal issues or support you may need.

Visas

Please note that if you require a student visa to study in the UK you must study on a full time basis.

Languages

All of the teaching and assessment on our HE programmes are conducted in English. Any applicant whose first language is not English should be able to demonstrate sufficient competence and ability to take instruction in English. We will look for a IELTs Academic/SELTs (Secure English Language Test) score of 6.0 with a minimum of 5.5 in each element or equivalent as a minimum entry requirement.

International **Student Fees**

If you have a Student Visa, before a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) will be issued you will need to pay the first year's fees for your course (for Bachelor Degree students) or the entire course fee (for the Access to HE Diploma). If a student visa application is refused by the UK Visas and Immigration, we will retain a £250 administration fee.

The institution code for both City College Norwich and Easton College is C54. The course code will depend on the course you are applying for.

Entry requirements

Contact our Advice Shop advisers on 01603 773 773 from the UK, or on +44 1603 773 773 from the rest of the world for help with your entry point into Higher Education at City College Norwich or Easton College.

Qualifications

You will usually need to be aged 18 or over and have obtained (or be in the process of obtaining) an appropriate qualification and sufficient UCAS points for the course you are applying for. The Colleges are committed to providing a higher level progression route for all of its Level 3 further education programmes. As a general guide, the most commonly acceptable qualifications are:

- . A. AS and T Levels
- BTEC National Diplomas/Certificates
- An Access to Higher Education Diploma
- Qualifications equivalent to the above.

If you already hold an HND, HNC or Foundation Degree qualification you may be eligible to enrol on a top up progression route programme and begin working towards a BA or BSc Honours Degree.

Interview

While many programmes require some specific entry qualifications or other criteria (such as passing a written English test), applicants may be offered an interview to determine motivation and commitment to the programme.

Mature students

Many of our mature students come to College after a break from education; some have few, if any, formal qualifications, but this is not necessarily a barrier. In these circumstances we take the time to assess whether the applicant has sufficient relevant experience that we could consider to be equivalent to the qualifications needed.

Access to HE

Access programmes are an alternative to traditional entry qualifications and provide excellent preparation for students who wish to move on to HE programmes. Evidence shows that students who take this route do well.



Recognition of Prior Learning, or Recognition of Prior Experiential Learning (RPL/RPEL)

If you have gained qualifications at an appropriate level that are relevant to the programme or have relevant experience gained in a work based or vocational setting, you may be given credit, and possibly exemption, from certain elements of the programme.

Claims for (RPL/RPEL) must be made and resolved before joining a programme, so be sure to ask at your interview if you think this could apply to you.

Our course applies the principles of business management, marketing and entrepreneurship to agriculture. You will cover everything from agronomy and soil science to finance and marketing, giving you a fully rounded preparation for running a modern enterprise. As well as leading arable, pig and poultry enterprises, Norfolk is home to centres of excellence for food research and health science and a new Food Enterprise Park.

About you

You will need 64 UCAS tariff points from A levels or equivalent and a minimum of GCSE Maths, English and Science (preferred) grades 9-4 (A*-C).

About the course

Our Agribusiness Management degree is designed to develop your knowledge, skills and application if you want to manage agricultural enterprises, agri-food businesses or become involved in academic and commercial research and advisory work.

What you will learn

Built round a core of science and management, including crop and soil science, crop and livestock production, and agribusiness strategic management, the programme provides scope to develop your individual interests through project-based work.

In addition to subject-specific modules students also undertake a first-year module covering professional and academic skills, and a second-year module on research skills, so that they can get the most out of their course and be well prepared for their research project in the final year.



Year 3: Contemporary community policing, responding to incidents, investigating and digital policing, roads policing, dissertation.

You can go on to do

This degree is designed as a route to become a police officer. However, students may also seek to progress into a wider range of careers within policing and the criminal justice system. About you

Our typical offer is 64 UCAS tariff points from A levels or equivalent and a minimum of GCSE maths, English and science (preferred) grade 4/C or above or National Literacy and Numeracy tests at Level 2 or 3. Access to HE Diplomas at Pass level with suitable science content are welcomed.

About the course

Our courses will provide you with an opportunity to study the key areas of sport and exercise science such as sports coaching, development, health, fitness, strength & conditioning. Our degree level sport courses are delivered through a mixture of workshops, lectures, seminars, practical sessions, tutorials and self-directed study. As your course progresses, there will be opportunities to specialise in areas of interest through flexible assessments. These include coursework (case studies/ reports), group presentations, practical assessments, reflective journals, open and closed book exams, poster presentations, portfolios of evidence and the creation and delivery of sporting and coaching events.

Want to study for a degree but don't have the qualifications?



Get to where you want to be with an Access to Higher Education course

Access to Higher Education courses are an ideal starting point that can help you develop the skills and qualifications to progress to studying for a degree and your future career.

Access courses are a flexible alternative to A Levels and are a recognised qualification for progression to Degree and Higher Education courses.

What can I study?

- Art & Design
- Business
- Criminal Justice and Policing
- Engineering
- Humanities and Social Sciences
- Land Based Studies (with Animal Science & Welfare and Ecology & Conservation pathways)
- Science for Health

All courses have been developed with employers and progression in mind, and many are part of the New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership's 10 priority sectors.

This means that you will be provided with the skills and qualifications needed to progress to further study and gain employment in growing industries.

Am I eligible to study?

To study an Access to Higher Education course you need to meet the following criteria:

- Aged 19+
- Have a grade C (grade 4) or above in GCSE English and Maths

Please note that we are not able to accept Adult Numeracy, Adult Literacy, Key Skills or Functional Skills in lieu of GCSEs.

Selection is by interview to discuss your suitability for the course and whether the course is right for you.

As part of this process you will need to complete online assessments and submit a short piece of writing to check you are at the right level to start the course. Advice can be given about alternative ways forward if necessary.

Widely recognised by universities

Access to Higher Education courses are widely recognised by UK universities and colleges, including our College.

We advise that if you are hoping to go on to do a degree course at a specific university, you should contact them to check that the Access to Higher Education course you have chosen is in an appropriate subject area and will be recognised by them.



International and ESOL students

International students whose qualification is not recognised by UK universities or colleges, and who are 19 and over, may also wish to choose this pathway as a route to enter degree level study. Applications from students whose first language is not English are welcome. We require evidence of proficiency in English (including writing, speaking, listening and reading).

Please note, the required minimum entry requirement is either:

- IELTS Academic (SELT): 6.0 overall (minimum 5.5 in all components); or
- GCSE English and GCSE
 Mathematics, both at either GCSE
 grade C and above or grade 5.



On completion of the course, successful trainees will have Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) enabling them to work as a teacher in maintained or non-maintained schools in England & Wales.

a substantial element of classroom experience as part of their training. It is the most practical way to gain Qualified Teacher Status in one year. The Norfolk Teacher Training Centre programme is based on an academic year and all trainee teachers receive:

- 120 days in the classroom gaining experience through our Training in School Curricular Programme. This will involve subject knowledge, lesson observation, team teaching, soloteaching and learning support across at least two key stages. Experience will be divided between at least two of our partner schools and academies.
- A dynamic Professional Development Programme with dedicated off-the-job training experiences, including weekly training sessions, termly conferences, subject knowledge development days and portfolio preparation days.

Post Graduate Teacher Apprentice (PGTA)

We support the new PGTA. This course is suitable for individuals who have experience of working in schools and have an employer who is able to support apprentices through their training year.

The course follows the same programme as our School Direct courses. However, the programme is slightly longer to allow time for candidates to prepare for their End Point Assessment (EPA) which must be completed as part of the Apprenticeship Standard.

What's required?

To successfully complete the course, you will be required to:

• Keep a Professional Practice Portfolio providing evidence of personal progress whilst in school. The Portfolio should also contain reflection on academic issues and reading of relevant published educational research.

- · Participate fully in the life of your placement schools, keeping a record of your progressive teaching experiences.
- Demonstrate that you have met the Secretary of State's Teachers' Standards.
- As part of the Professional Development Programme, you will also complete three written assignments connecting your school-based experience within the context of pedagogical research.

Outstanding success

NTTC has over 60 partner schools and academies throughout Norfolk, offering trainees the opportunity to experience teaching in a wide variety of settings.

Every year, over 95% of the trainees who successfully complete our course and gain QTS go in to teaching jobs in schools.

How to apply

To apply for teacher training with NTTC you need to have a degree, a demonstrable commitment to the subject/ age phase you want to teach and a grade C/4 or above in English and Maths (and Science for Primary).

Generous bursaries

Generous bursaries are available of up to £24,000 depending on the subject you wish to teach through School Direct. The bursary is designed to support you through your training and to make life easy, we apply for the bursary on your behalf, so you don't have to.



Norfolk House

City College Norwich's School of Higher Education is in the heart of the city centre on Exchange Street.

There is no car parking available, but lots of car parks are located near by. The nearest bus stops are on Castle Meadow, Tombland or Prince of Wales Road.

Ipswich Road

Our main college campus is located on Ipswich Road approximately 1/2 mile from the City Centre.

Car parking is available and bus stops are located outside the college.

Easton College

Easton College is located just 8 miles outside of Norwich off the A47.

Car parking is available on campus and the site is well served by direct bus routes and non-direct from Norwich city centre.

International Aviation **Academy Norwich**

The Academy is located 4 miles outside of Norwich next to Norwich Airport.

Car parking is available and the nearest bus stop is located 10 minutes' walk away.



By bus:

By train:

The main Norwich Thorpe Train Station is located about 1.5 miles from the College. First Bus and Konectbus operate frequently between the Rail Station and the City Centre which is about an 8-10 minute walk away from St Stephens Street/Red Lion Street. First Counties have regular buses that service the Train Station to Castle Meadow (Blue Line).

The Park & Ride routes covering the College's Ipswich Road campus are;



Airport and Thickthorn P&R sites operate to Newmarket Road/Town Close Road which is a 5 minute walk. Postwick P&R operates to St Stephens Street in the city centre which is an 8 minute walk.

Routes run Monday to Saturday with arrivals in the city before 7am and last buses back at approximately 7pm depending on the site. A 16-19 (no ID required!) day ticket is £1.90 and a 10 day ticket is £14.70. More fares and times information is available at norwichparkandride.co.uk
