Your study options

We understand how important it is to find the best route for you after leaving school. It is important to think about the subjects you enjoy, how you like to learn and where you want to progress to after college.

There are four main options you can choose from after your GCSEs, with different qualifications available to study at each of our campuses at Easton College, City College Norwich and Paston College.

Which route is for me?

A Levels

At City College Norwich Sixth Form and Paston College

A Levels are a popular choice for those aiming for university. They provide in-depth study in specific subjects, with students typically choosing three subjects to make up a full-time programme over two years. Each A Level is equivalent to a Level 3 qualification and provides UCAS points. A Levels are assessed by exams.

T Levels

At Easton College, City College Norwich and Paston College

T Levels blend academic study with practical learning, with a big emphasis on providing in-depth industry experience. They include an industry placement of around 45 days, providing valuable experience in the workplace where employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry. They are equivalent in size to three A Levels, and you will be assessed through a combination of exams and employerset projects. Many T Level students progress to university or onto higher level apprenticeships.

Apprenticeships

At Easton College and City College Norwich

An apprenticeship is a job where you will earn, combining work with training and study. You will usually spend one day a week at college and the rest with your employer. Apprenticeships start at Level 2 and go all the way up to degree-level, so you can start straight from school or later in your learning journey. You will need to find an employer to take you on as an apprentice, with many actively hiring, it's a simple step in the process. Find out more about applying for an Apprenticeship on page 40.

Career-focused qualifications

At Easton College, City College Norwich and Paston College

Technical and vocational qualifications such as BTECs offer a blend of classroom study and practical learning. You will choose one subject to study full time, and each subject focuses on a specific job or employment area, such as agriculture, animal studies or uniformed services. The level you start on will depend on the grades you achieve at school. While there may be some written exams, these courses also involve practical assessments, coursework, and work-based evidence.

For some students who are not yet at the stage to access wider college courses or have barriers to learning or employment, alternative routes are also available. These can support you to move into wider college courses, apprenticeships and employment. These include:

Inclusive Learning and MINT

Easton College, City College Norwich and Paston College

Designed to help you plan for the future and progress onto your chosen next step. Our courses are divided into four pathways to help you settle into college and prepare for living in your community, going out to work or progressing onto further college courses. Find out more on page 30.

Aspire Skills Academy

City College Norwich

Choose from two pathways where you can either experience taster sessions in your chosen vocational area and prepare to progress to further study, or develop your employability skills and prepare for the world of work. These courses have several enrolment points throughout the year, for more information speak to our Advice and Guidance team.

Academic Progression

Paston College and City College Norwich

Where you will study new or additional GCSEs to help you develop your skills and gain the grades you need to progress to your chosen pathway the following year. Providing A Levels, technical and vocational qualifications, T Levels, Apprenticeships, degrees and more, our three distinct campuses provide the opportunity for students to learn in the environment most suited to them.

Each year we support around 10,000 students, including 1,500 apprentices and 800 learners with an education, health and care plan (EHCP). We pride ourselves on being an inclusive college, led by experienced and specialist staff.

Here's a taste of what each of our colleges have to offer:



Animal Management Centre – Easton College

Approved as an educational member of the British and Irish Association of Zoos and Aquariums (BIAZA), our centre gives students the chance to work with small mammals, reptiles, birds, and endangered aquatic species.



Centre of Excellence for Sport – Easton College

Following a £1.7m refurbishment, our Sports Centre includes upgraded fitness suites, an outdoor leadership classroom, and a sports performance lab. These complement our Equestrian Centre, 3G pitches, and Tennis Centre with eight indoor hard courts and four European red courts used for international events.



Easton Farm and Estate - Easton College

160 hectares of nature-based teaching space managed with conservation, sustainability and environmental considerations, including a mixed farming system with beef, sheep and cereal production which complement each other.



Construction Skills Hub - City College Norwich

The £4.4 million Construction Skills Hub, opened in March 2025, features two large plumbing and electrical workshops across two floors. Each workshop has 10 practical bays and large central workbenches. The hub plays a key role in training the next generation of electricians and plumbers to meet the growing demand for skilled workers.



Digi-Tech Factory - City College Norwich

A unique facility that is purpose-built for teaching the latest digital skills, from coding and hardware to advanced manufacturing, animation and games design, media production, construction and engineering design.



Health Wing - City College Norwich

As a leading agriculture college, you will learn on our 160-hectare operational commercial farm, consisting of arable fields, grazing meadows and woodlands. With cattle and sheep on campus, you will gain hands on experience of farm management and animal husbandry

What you will study

Our agriculture courses will introduce you to the basics of agriculture and rural environments, focusing on foundational skills and knowledge. You will gain practical skills and theoretical knowledge in modern agricultural practices, crop production, and livestock management.

As you advance through your studies, you will delve deeper into agricultural science, farm management, and agribusiness strategies. Highlights of our programmes include using spray drones and tractor simulators, working on a commercial farm, operating modern machinery, and participating in external trips, industry speaker engagements, workshops, and master classes. We have great links with the Food and Farming Discovery Trust and the Farming and Wildlife Advisory Group, among others.

We also provide enrichment opportunities alongside your course, including taking part in the Royal Norfolk Show and visiting the Lincolnshire Agricultural Machinery Manufacturers Association (LAMMA) show.

Where your course can take you

You could progress to study the next level at college, secure an Apprenticeship, explore degree-level courses in agriculture and agricultural management or move into employment.

Career options include farm worker, agricultural technician, farm manager, agribusiness consultant, agricultural researcher and agronomist to name a few.

You will gain hands-on experience working on a commercial farm, learning the entire process from seed to harvest. You will learn to operate the latest agricultural machinery, ensuring you are well-prepared for the demands of modern farming. Additionally, you will experience cutting-edge technology with spray drones for precision agriculture and tractor simulators for safe and effective machinery operation.

What you will study

Our land-based engineering course covers the maintenance and operation of agricultural machinery and equipment, emphasising technical skills and safety.

You will work in modern, well-equipped workshops, gaining hands-on experience with the latest tools and equipment. This includes the servicing and maintenance of farming machinery from 4x4s and quad bikes to tractors and advanced technical equipment.

You will participate in various college and external projects, applying your skills to real-world engineering challenges. External trips, industry engagements, workshops, and masterclasses will keep you up-to-date with the latest advancements in land-based engineering and help you put the skills you have learnt at college into practice. You will also benefit from our close relationship with many of the big dealerships in our region, including strong links to Thurlow Nunn Standen.

You will work in our modern, well-equipped workshops, gaining hands-on experience with the latest tools and equipment. In addition to our on-site facilities, you will join external trips, interact with industry professionals, and attend workshops and masterclasses to experience and engage with the latest advancements in land-based engineering.


Four GCSEs at grade 3 or above including a minimum grade 3 in English language and maths

Where your course can take you

On completion of your course, you could progress to complete a Land-Based Service Engineering Apprenticeship, consider degree-level study or move into employment. Through City College Norwich Higher Education at Easton College, you can study a range of degrees or higher apprenticeships in engineering as an alternative to going away to university.

Career options include agricultural machinery technician, maintenance engineer, service technician, equipment operator, robotics and automation engineer, machinery designer/developer and much more.





Whether your passion lies in zookeeping, veterinary nursing, or working in kennels and catteries, our courses will provide you with the skills and knowledge needed for a dynamic career in the animal care and management sector. You will benefit from hands-on experience caring for our variety of animals including alpacas, ferrets and rare exotic fish

What you will study

Studying in our modern Animal Management Centre, you will develop theoretical knowledge and practical skills, while exploring the principles of animal health, welfare, behaviour and biology. You will care for a variety of animals including small mammals, reptiles, birds, aquatics, and large livestock, gaining the essential skills required for your chosen career. You will gain hands-on experience in animal management, from feeding and cleaning to training, enrichment, and handling skills.

Additionally, our programmes include practical work experience and weekend duties. Your placement will provide valuable real-world experiences in settings such as veterinary practices, kennels and catteries, pet shops and zoos. You will also enjoy a variety of trips to zoos and public aquariums, such as Colchester Zoo, Banham Zoo and Hunstanton Sea Life Centre.

Our Level 3 students also have the opportunity to travel to South Africa to take part in wildlife conservation and community activities. This is an amazing opportunity to see the Big Five in their native habitat!

Where your course can take you

On completion of your course, you could progress to the next level at college or consider an apprenticeship or degree-level study. Through City College Norwich Higher Education at Easton College, we offer degrees in Animal Science, Wildlife and Conservation, and Zoology, as well as a Level 3 Veterinary Nursing Apprenticeship.

Career options include zookeeper, animal technician, veterinary nurse, dog groomer or animal behaviourist.

A minimum of three GCSEs at grade 2 or above, including English language or maths, or equivalent

Four GCSEs at grade 3, including science, and English language or maths

Animal Nursing Assistant Level 2

Four GCSEs at grade 4, including science, English language and maths. You will also need a two-week placement at a veterinary practice.

T Level in Animal Management and Behaviour Level 3

Four GCSEs at grade 4, including science, English language and maths

T Level in Animal Management and Science Level 3

Five GCSEs at grade 6, including science, English language and maths

Standout facilities

Our Animal Management Centre is home to a diverse array of species, including critically endangered fish from South America, a variety of amphibians, snakes and lizards such as our boa constrictor, as well as a selection of birds and mammals, including goats and alpacas.

Recent enhancements to the centre include a new coral propagation and marine fish breeding system, zoo-style enclosures for our reptiles, amphibians and invertebrates, a pet shop-style exotics room, and upgrades to our mammal rooms and paddock area. Additionally, we have constructed a new kennel block designed to demonstrate the high standards required to operate a kennel business.



The construction industry offers a vast range of career opportunities, from working on residential buildings to large-scale infrastructure projects. You could choose to pursue a career in the many different stages of construction, from planning and design to construction and maintenance, working for independent building companies to leading construction contractors

What you will study

Our Multi Skills course is perfect for students who are interested in construction but are unsure which trade to specialise in. During the course you will cover a range of trade areas including bricklaying, tiling, plumbing and plastering.

You will spend most of your time in our multi-purpose workshop, while developing your technical knowledge in a classroom environment. Units you will cover include painting techniques, bending and joining copper pipes, installing one-way lighting circuits, tiling a plain wall and half brick walling. Health and safety are also a big part of the course, and you will develop your understanding of safe working practices, tools and equipment.

You will benefit from site visits, trips and employer talks to experience what it is like to work in the construction industry, alongside attending careers fairs to explore your next steps. You will also be supported to develop your CV for work opportunities.

Where your course can take you

This course can support you to progress to a trade specific Level 1 course in your chosen pathway. You can also explore opportunities for an Apprenticeship or move into sustainable employment.

Careers in the sector include working as a bricklayer, painter and decorator, plumber, carpenter, property developer, project planner or quantity surveyor supported by further training.

Construction Multi Skills Level 1

No formal entry requirements. You will need to attend an interview and taster day

Standout facilities

You will learn in the David Lawrence Construction Centre where you will benefit from industrystandard workshops and equipment supporting your development in a range of skills including bricklaying, tiling, plumbing and plastering.



This will be supported by placements and enrichment opportunities with employers such as Morgan Sindall, LSI Architects and Kier.











Study for a career in the countryside on our 160-hectare estate where you will learn about conservation, biodiversity, ecology, wildlife habitat management and the wide range of careers available in this area

What you will study

Our land and wildlife management courses cover essential topics related to land management, including soil science, plant biology, and environmental conservation. You will focus on conservation techniques, wildlife habitats, and sustainable land use practices.

As you advance through your studies, your training will also include ecosystem management, wildlife conservation, and environmental policy. You will have opportunities to work with industry partners on real-world conservation projects and be involved in projects on the college water meadows and wider estate. Your course will also support you to earn leadership qualifications that will prepare you for supervisory roles in conservation and environmental management after your studies.

In addition, you will benefit from our fantastic employer links working with the National Trust and Broads Authority to offer work experience placements and educational visits to estates, country parks and wildlife reserves.

Standout facilities

You will have the chance to get involved with conservation projects on our college water meadows and wider estate, applying your skills to protect and enhance local ecosystems. Away from campus, you will benefit from external trips and industry engagement, interacting with conservation professionals, and attending workshops and masterclasses to expand your knowledge and skills in

What you will study

You will gain invaluable hands-on experience with our horses at our Equine Centre, where you will have opportunities to ride in our arena, train on our cross-country course, and across our estate.

You will delve deep into equine care and management, covering essential topics such as horse health and wellbeing, behaviour, biology and grooming. Depending on your course, you will learn about stable duties, nutrition, tack and equipment, coaching, rehabilitation and therapy. You will also care for our horses, from feeding and mucking out to grooming and exercise. You will carry out weekend duties, designed to increase your confidence and support your progression you into the world of work.

Our courses will help you to explore the vast range of career opportunities available in this field. You will complete practical work experience in settings such as riding schools, liveries, and rescue centres as well as enjoying trips to employers such as Redwings Horse Sanctuary and Great Yarmouth Racecourse. Level 3 students will also have an opportunity to travel to South Africa to take part in a horseback safari and community activities to support their studies.

Where your course can take you

On completion of your course, you could progress to the next level at college or consider an Apprenticeship or degree-level study.

Our courses will support you to explore a variety of careers in areas such as a competition groom, farrier, riding instructor, nutritionist and stable manager, or you might want to own and run your own livery yard.

Our state-of-the-art Equine Centre is a British Horse Society approved riding centre, livery and facilities centre, with Highly Commended status. We host dressage and jumping competitions throughout the year and are host to Norfolk Indoor Driving and local Pony Clubs.

Our facilities include an indoor arena with first floor viewing gallery, an all-weather floodlit outdoor arena, internal and external stabling, a walker for up to five horses, solarium, Racewood riding simulator, rider fitness studio and cross-country course.

Our floristry courses will immerse you in a creative and inspiring environment, working with fresh flowers, plants, and foliage to craft stunning designs. You will gain hands-on experience in floral arrangement, event styling, and plant care

What you will study

Our floristry courses will introduce you to the exciting world of floral design, giving you the skills to create stunning arrangements and understand the business of floristry. You will learn key design principles, plant care, and customer service. while advanced lessons explore techniques for large-scale displays, event planning, and running a floristry business. With access to our triple-span polytunnel for growing flowers, a cutting garden for fresh materials, and hands-on projects across the college estate, you will gain plenty of practical experience.

Beyond the classroom, you will participate in external trips and industry engagement, where you will meet leading florists, attend workshops, and take part in masterclasses to refine your skills and build valuable connections within the industry. With this mix of creative learning, practical experience, and industry exposure, you will be well-prepared for an exciting future in floristry.

Where your course can take you

On completion of your course, you could progress to the next level at college or consider an Apprenticeship or degree-level study.

Our courses will support you to explore a variety of careers in areas such as a florist or an event floral designer, or you might want to own and run your own floristry business.



Standout facilities

You will benefit from our triple span polytunnel, where you can grow a variety of flowers and plants used in floristry, giving you hands-on experience with different floral materials. You will have the opportunity to take part in college estate work, engaging in real-world floristry projects that enhance your understanding of floral design and event planning. You will also have access to our cutting garden to source fresh flowers for your designs, ensuring you work with the best materials available.





Our tree and woodland management and maintenance course will immerse you in a practical and outdoor-focused environment, working with trees, woodlands, and natural habitats to develop essential skills. You will gain hands-on experience in arboriculture, forestry operations, and woodland conservation, preparing you for a career in sustainable forest and land management

What you will study

This course will open the door to a specialist and rewarding field, where you will develop the knowledge and skills needed for careers in arboriculture, forestry, and woodland conservation. From tree care and forest management to habitat protection and sustainable land use, the course offers a strong foundation in both theory and practice.

You will gain hands-on experience working in our college woodland and external sites, developing practical skills in woodland management and conservation. You will also have the opportunity to earn industry-recognised NPTC qualifications, boosting your employability in the forestry and arboriculture sectors. Learning is enriched through external trips, expert-led workshops, and masterclasses - giving you valuable insight and connections to support your future in the land-based industries.

Where your course can take you

After completing your tree and woodland management course, you will be well-prepared to take the next step - whether that's progressing to further study, starting an Apprenticeship, or moving into degree-level education. You could study a BSc (Hons) Wildlife and Conservation degree through City College Norwich Higher Education at Easton College.

This course opens up a variety of career paths within the forestry and arboriculture industries, including roles such as arborist, forestry manager, woodland conservation officer, forestry team member, or tree nursery worker.

T Level in Tree and Woodland Management and Maintenance Level 3

Four GCSEs at grade 4 or above including a minimum grade 4 in English language, maths and science

Standout facilities

You will benefit from Easton College's impressive 200-hectare estate, which includes extensive woodland and a dedicated arboretum - providing the ideal setting for hands-on training in tree and woodland management. You will gain practical experience in arboriculture, forest maintenance, and conservation across both the college's own woodland and external sites.





Our horticulture course will engage you in a practical and inspiring environment, working with plants, soil, and landscapes to develop essential skills. You will gain hands-on experience in plant cultivation, garden design, landscape management and sustainable horticultural practices

What you will study

Our horticulture course will open the door to a vibrant and rewarding field, where you will develop the knowledge and skills to grow, design, and manage a wide variety of plants and landscapes. From the fundamentals of plant care and garden planning to more advanced topics like sustainable practices and horticultural business, the course offers a well-rounded learning experience.

What you will study


Whatever you're aiming for, we have a variety of courses available to meet your needs and support you to achieve your personal goals across our three campuses at Easton College, City College Norwich, and Paston College.

If you join one of our courses, you will most likely be in a group of up to eight students and you will be supported by a teacher and an LSA in the class. Most of our courses are three days a week, but if you are not able to manage this we can arrange for you to have a reduced timetable to help you attend college.

You will work closely with your course tutor who will guide you through your course, set you personal targets and record your progress. If you have an EHCP they will use this to understand your needs and to make sure that you get the support you require to work towards achieving your EHCP outcomes.

Depending on your needs and what you want to do in the future, you may spend your time with us all at one campus or you may progress onto one of our other campuses to continue your learning journey. Your course leader will work with you and your family/carers to make a plan that suits you.

Enrolment occurs in the last two weeks of August. We will send you an appointment date and time at the start of August. During your appointment, you will meet your tutor, provide details of the qualifications you have achieved, and receive full information about your course.





GCSE English language

English language and literacy are highly valued skills in both education and employment. It is about being able to effectively communicate, confidently articulate and express your thoughts, as well as actively listening and understanding other viewpoints. Therefore, English skills are an essential part of your programme of study and your future progression plans.

GCSE maths

Maths and numeracy skills are a central part of your programme of study. It is not just about knowing how to carry out calculations and getting the right answer; it is about improving your skills in recognising problems, finding possible solutions and communicating your reasoning. Therefore, maths skills are an essential part of your future progression in education and employment.

English language and maths Functional Skills

English language and maths are essential qualifications that give you a range of skills for life. If you have gaps in your subject knowledge that need further development before progressing to GCSEs, then Functional Skills courses are a great starting point. 




Wellbeing Team

If a direct service is not available from where you live, you can get the free shuttle bus direct to the campus from Norwich city centre. You can catch the shuttle bus from Castle Meadow, Norwich Bus Station, Norwich Train Station or St Stephens Street.

There are lots of student travel discounts available. We advise that you investigate season tickets offered directly from the operator as these may to be cheaper and more flexible than the Norfolk County Council pass.


