When you study on a university-level course with us, you will be working towards a qualification that is recognised and respected – opening a world of opportunity for your continued learning and career development. We offer a wide range of qualifications designed to suit different ambitions, academic backgrounds, and career goals. Whether you are pursuing undergraduate study, developing your professional skills, or undertaking advanced research, you will find a course that aligns with your aspirations.

Higher Education providers like to use quite a lot of jargon, so we've provided a definition of the key terms we use to describe our courses.



Qualification Type	Level	Duration	Description
Bachelor's Degrees given the title of either Bachelor of Art (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BSc), typically with honours (Hons)	Level 6	3 years	Usually three-year programmes with the depth of study increasing through the three years i.e. you will start with Level 4 modules in year one, moving through Level 5 and onto Level 6 modules by the final year.
Foundation Degrees given the title of either Foundation degree of Arts (FdA) or Foundation degree of Science (FdSc)	Level 5	2 years	This level of study is equivalent to the first two years of an undergraduate bachelor degree.
Higher National Diploma (HND)	Level 5	2 years	These are more advanced than a HNC and are often used as a pathway to a full degree.
Higher National Certificate (HNC)	Level 4	1 year	This is a work-related, or vocational, higher education qualification, equivalent to the first year of a degree.
Higher and Degree Apprenticeships	Levels 4-6	Varies	Work-based learning through an employer, where you will follow standard qualification levels.
Teacher Training (NTTC)	Level 7	Varies	Primary and secondary teacher training courses leading to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) - a legal requirement to teach in state schools in England.

# **Degrees awarded by UEA**

This means that our degrees are awarded by UEA, which ranks among the UK's top 25 universities (Complete University Guide 2025) and top 30 (The Mail 2025), and is in the UK's top 20 for research quality (Times Higher Education Rankings – REF 2021).

# HNCs and HNDs recognised by employers

Our HNC and HND courses are awarded by Pearson, the leading awarding body for Higher National qualifications in the UK. The robust and industry-relevant content within these qualifications means that employers in your chosen sector will recognise your achievements and the hands-on experience completed throughout your course.

# **Higher Technical Qualifications**

Some of the Higher Nationals and degrees that are delivered are also HTQs. These are Level 4 or 5 qualifications that have been quality marked by IfATE to indicate their alignment to employer-led occupational standards. They are technical qualifications that employers have helped develop so you can get the right training and skills you need. HTQs are an alternative to apprenticeships or degrees. They may suit you if you want a more practical, employer-led study programme. Look out for the HTQ logo against courses with this quality mark.

Access to Higher Education courses offer an excellent starting point, helping you gain the skills and qualifications needed to progress to degree-level study and pursue your chosen career. Our Access to Higher Education Diplomas, validated by the Cambridge Access Validating Agency (CAVA), are designed to prepare you for university and beyond.

These flexible Level 3 qualifications are a well-recognised alternative to A Levels, designed with both career progression and employer needs in mind. Many of our diplomas align with Local Skills Improvement Plans and the broader demands of the local economy, preparing you for further study and employment in rapidly developing industries.

You'll build study skills through our academic development programme, with guidance from your course leader throughout. Our dedicated Access to HE team will also support your university application, whether you continue your studies with us or apply elsewhere.

#### Am I eligible to study?

To study an Access to Higher Education course you need to meet the following criteria:

- Aaed 19+
- Have a grade C (grade 4) or above in GCSE English and Maths

Selection is based on an interview, during which we'll discuss your suitability for the course and ensure it aligns with your goals and needs.

Currently: An avionics apprentice with Eagle Copters in Calgary, Canada

I graduated with a BSc (Hons) in Professional Aviation Engineering Practice in 2022, and shortly afterwards I secured an avionics apprenticeship with Eagle Copters in Calgary, Canada. I'm absolutely loving the role – no two days are ever

the same!

I've had the opportunity to work on a wide range of aircraft, including helicopters used by the Calgary Police, air ambulances, and those involved in aerial firefighting – which is especially important here due to the frequent forest fires. One of the highlights so far has been working on a helicopter that appeared in the final series of Stranger Things! At the moment, we're working on a Bell 205 helicopter with a 1963 serial number that actually flew in the Vietnam War. The variety of projects I get to be involved in is incredible.

My time on the course really gave me the knowledge and practical skills I needed to step straight into the industry.

Employers are really keen on candidates who've had hands-on experience, and the Boeing 737 at the International Aviation Academy – or 'Elsie' as we all called her – was perfect for that. We had loads of opportunities to apply what we were learning in a real-world setting.

Another major benefit was learning from lecturers who had worked in the aviation industry for years – both from KLM and City College Norwich. Their insights and experience were invaluable and played a big part in helping me land my first position after graduation.

Looking ahead, I'm aiming to get my avionics licence and eventually move into aircraft design and certification engineering.



Studied: BSc (Hons) Wildlife and Conservation Currently: Volunteering with the RSPB on a remote island off Northern Ireland

I began my journey with City College Norwich at Easton College by studying a Level 3 in Countryside Management, while also volunteering regularly with local ecological organisations. I was inspired to stay on at CCN HE and went on to complete a BSc (Hons) in Wildlife and Conservation in 2023.

CCN HE is a fantastic alternative to a traditional university, particularly if you want to work or volunteer alongside your studies. Having access to the farm and the nature reserve for practical sessions was such a valuable part of my experience.

I've loved all the practical fieldwork modules and species identification we get to do. It's been a lot of fun applying what I've learnt in the classroom to real-world environments. As someone from a non-environmental background, the course has given me direction and allowed me to find what

I'm passionate about, sparking a lifelong interest in nature and wildlife.

Since graduating, I've continued volunteering, including butterfly surveys at Broadland Country Park and meadow work with the Trust for Conservation Volunteers. Leading volunteer groups has also helped me grow my leadership skills.

Volunteering alongside my studies gave me practical experience and the confidence to apply what I was learning in real-life settings.

I'm excited to be joining a three-month residential volunteering project with the RSPB on a remote island off Northern Ireland. After that, I hope to work as a ranger or warden, while continuing my volunteering journey.



Get stuck into real-world learning at our cutting-edge Animal Management Centre on our Easton College campus - purpose-built to mirror professional environments found in zoos, aquariums, and the pet care industry.

You'll work hands-on with a wide variety of animals, building the practical skills you'll need for exciting careers in animal care, veterinary nursing, zoology, conservation and more. Everything about the centre is designed to reflect the industry - giving you the confidence, experience and edge to step straight into the world of animal management.

Step into our Exotic Environments - one of our rooms has been transformed to resemble a modern zoo, complete with large walk-in enclosures that house incredible species like a boa constrictor and a water dragon. These immersive enclosures allow the animals to express natural behaviours in realistic surroundings - and give you first-hand experience managing complex habitats.

In our second exotic room, you'll find enclosures modelled on the pet retail industry. It's your chance to get familiar with handling and caring for species commonly found in pet shops, preparing you for roles in commercial animal care.

Head into the Aquatics Room and you'll discover our custom-built coral propagation and fish breeding system. It's packed with the latest tech, including storm simulation features and advanced water quality monitoring - all of which can be controlled at the touch of a button. With openaccess filtration systems, you'll learn the science behind aquatic care in a clear, hands-on way.


You'll also be part of our exciting conservation work. We care for goodeids - an endangered species of freshwater fish - through our partnership with the Zoological Society of London (ZSL). The Animal Management Centre is a member of the British and Irish Association of Zoos and Aquariums (BIAZA) and utilises the Zoological Information Management System (ZIMS) to record data about the species in our care, as well as Seneye to monitor our aquatic systems. ZIMS is widely used in zoos globally and contributes to modern zoo research. Our collection is overseen by a specialist zoo veterinary team, ensuring our animals receive care that meets the highest industry standards.

This also promotes opportunities for career progression and requires the apprentice to successfully complete an End Point Assessment, to demonstrate that they have met all the Healthcare Assistant Practitioner Standards and meet the required standard of competency.

To gain the knowledge and skills required for the Apprenticeship, the programme incorporates a FdSc Mental Health Studies degree, which is validated by UEA.

If I had to pick a favourite moment, it wouldn't be a single event, it would be the whole journey. Just having the courage to do it. I'll remember this experience for the rest of my life.



# **UCAS** application cycle



We believe that financial circumstances should never be a barrier to education. We are committed to supporting our students through a range of financial assistance options, including bursaries and hardship funds. Whether you're just starting your studies or continuing your academic journey, our support services are here to help you manage the cost of university life with confidence.

For 2026/27 entry, for home students, the standard cost of our full-time degree courses (including Foundation Degrees) is £9,535 per year. International fees are £15,052 per year.

HNCs and HNDs are charged as follows:

- HNC or HND (per 15 credit unit): £882 or £1,066 for International Students
- HNC or HND "top up" (120 credits): £7,056 or £8,526 for International Students
- Full HND (240 credits): £14,112 or £17.052 for International Students

In addition to the tuition fees above, there are Pearson registration fees which are charged separately. These are not yet set by Pearson, but we expect them to be under £400 in year one, with a further learner registration fee of approximately £30 for each subsequent year of study. You can find full fee information for all our courses - including the fees applicable for international students - contained within the detailed course information listings on our website.

# **Paying fees yourself**

Our college offers an instalment plan to spread the cost of fees. The plan requires you to pay 25% of the fee on enrolment and the balance will be collected by direct debit in equal instalments over the following three months.

# **Student loans**

You may be eligible for a tuition fee loan from Student Finance England to cover your fees. There may also be maintenance loans available depending on your circumstances.

Student loans do not have to be paid back until after you complete your course, and you are earning at least £25k.

If you have dependent children, you may also be eligible for other help such as a Parents Learning Allowance or a Childcare Grant. If you are disabled. you may be eligible for a Disabled Students Allowance.

# If your employer is paying your tuition fees

If your employer is paying your fees, they must complete an Employer Authorisation form and sign and stamp it to confirm that they agree to pay your fee.

# **Low-Income Bursary**

If your household income is £20,000 or less per year, you'll automatically be eligible for our £500 annual bursary. There's no need to apply - your eligibility will be assessed using information provided by Student Finance England.

# Accommodation

# for HE students

We offer accommodation for our Degree and Higher Education students at our Easton College campus to the west of Norwich.

Our accommodation has single study bedrooms. Although meals may be purchased from college catering outlets during term times, rooms are let on a self-catering basis for the academic year (35 weeks).

# What's included in the accommodation?

All rooms contain a bed and mattress, a desk, chair, wardrobe, a hot and cold tapped sink, plenty of storage space, a set of curtains, a waste paper basket, a single vanity mirror and light and a good-sized pinboard for organisation. All rooms are centrally heated at no extra cost.

# **Home comforts**

We want you to feel at home and relaxed in your own space. You can create your own spaces within your rooms by using posters, photos, books, games consoles and computers. These are all perfect accessories to bring along to help you settle and feel at home.

Please do not bring microwaves, candles, incense sticks or anything flammable. Please refrain from bringing loudspeakers. You are able to bring your own fridges and televisions (a TV licence is required).

# Facilities and activities

Easton College boasts some excellent facilities to keep you active and entertained. This includes our Tennis Centre, gym and fitness centre and 3G pitch.

# Accommodation costs and payment plans

HE Accommodation is rented for a set price of £155\* per week for the duration of the standard HE academic year. This includes Wi-Fi, electricity, water and all other amenities. \*costs are subject to inflationary increase for 2026/27.

Your contract will start in September 2026 and end in June 2027 (subject to course requirements).

Please note the contract relates to academic weeks and your room will need to be emptied during the Christmas period.

Our en-suite rooms are single occupancy study rooms with a bathroom/wet room included. These cost £142.20 per week (inclusive of bills) on a self-catering basis. There is also a refundable £200 damage deposit paid upon application.

We offer two payment options:

**Option 1** - Total cost paid at the start of term (September)

**Option 2** - Three equal termly instalments coinciding with SLC Maintenance Loan payments


You can apply for student accommodation by scanning the QR code. A deposit of £200 is required at the time of your application.

Norwich is at the centre of a travel network which connects it to all of the towns and villages in the region and onwards to London, the Midlands, the Northern counties and beyond.

London is less than two hours away by a direct train service, which leaves Norwich every thirty minutes. You can also get there by a non-stop coach service, run by National Express from the bus station in the city centre. Heading north, you can be in Leeds in less than three and a half hours by joining the East Coast main line, or Newcastle in under four; less than you might think, which is great for travelling here as well as getting out and about while you study.

Norwich is in the heart of Norfolk, one of the most beautiful counties in the UK.

Living here, you will be close to the Broads, the network of quiet waterways that welcomes sailors, cyclists, paddlers and walkers all year round. Sipping a drink at a riverside pub can be a perfect break from your studies and hiring a boat for a day out with friends is a great way to celebrate your results in the summer. # **Sport and fitness**


You won't have to look far in Norwich to find a proud supporter of Norwich City, our local football team.

Norwich Train Station is approximately 1.5 miles from our Ipswich Road campus. Bus services operate frequently between the train station and the city centre, which is about an 8-10 minute walk away from St Stephens Street/Red Lion Street.

Easton College is located 6.5 miles from Norwich city centre, off the A47. Car parking is available on campus and the nearby village of Easton is well-served by direct bus routes from the city centre.

# **Ipswich Road**

The Ipswich Road campus is located on Ipswich Road, approximately 1/2 mile from the city centre. Car parking is available on campus and bus stops are located outside the college.

# International Aviation Academy Norwich

The Academy is located 4 miles outside Norwich, next to Norwich Airport. Car parking is available and the nearest bus stop is 10 minutes walk away.





Course Committees take place three times a year and are attended by:

- The Head of Higher Education or the Assistant Principal for Higher Education and Adults
- The Higher Education Curriculum Lead for that course
- · The course delivery team
- Employers involved in the programme
- UEA representatives

Your experience shapes these meetings, and your course rep will feed this back to the meeting. From this feedback there will be specific actions to improve your experience, which are recorded and tracked through our 'You Said, We Did' action log.

For example, our students requested improved accessibility for one of our buildings, so we introduced a colour-coded system to each floor to make it easier to navigate.

Training for student reps is provided by our Higher Education Leadership team supported by our Students' Union.

The Silver rating means students can expect very high-quality teaching and support, with some areas considered outstanding.


Awarded by a panel of academic experts and student representatives, TEF ratings help future students make informed choices about where to study.

#### Browse the shelves

You can borrow any resources by speaking to the library staff at the front desk of each of our campus libraries.

#### Reservations

You can use the library's reservations service to request items from any college library, to be collected from your chosen library at a time you choose.

### eBooks

eBooks are a great alternative to borrowing hard copies from the library or purchasing your own books. They are free to use/download at a library computer, or your own device at home.

#### **Online Journal Databases**

You will have access to journal databases, allowing you to search thousands of online journals at the same time. Taylor and Francis, SAGE and ScienceDirect are the largest databases we offer access to.

#### Referencing

Our library staff are happy to check through your references and in-text citations used in assignments. They are able to check the first three instances of each referencing format, for example books, journal articles and websites, and will leave comments for you to action.

We also offer video guidance on referencing, a referencing checklist and a leaflet with examples of how to format your full references and in-text citations using Harvard referencing.

#### Proofreading

The library team can proofread up to 500 words of any written assignment. They can check for errors in spelling, grammar, punctuation, in-text citations, and structure.
